



showing areas of economic potential and areas of high conservation value in relation to Inuit land use and harvesting patterns. We are looking forward to NTI's participation in those panels. The panels will be followed by three regional public hearings in the spring and public release of the Nunavut Land Use Plan in September 2010.

The Commission continues to encourage NTI and the Regional Inuit Associations participation in the land use planning process. Over the past several months NPC has been soliciting guidance from government, NTI and RIA land managers on issues and priorities to be considered as part of the planning process. As this exercise will conclude at the end of October, we would be interested in learning if NTI has additional data or information that would enhance our baseline knowledge. As well, if NTI has established Nunavut wide or region specific goals and objectives for Inuit Owned Lands that are not captured by 11.4.1(a), this information would also be useful.
