- The Commission request that participants submit their presentations on or before **August 12, 2022**.

Participants (except the Governments of Canada and Nunavut, and Nunavut Tunngavik Inc.) will be granted **25 minutes** to present evidence to the Commissioners followed by **20 minutes** for questions and responses from the Commission and other participants. Recognizing that certain participants may require additional time to present due to the number of issues they are bringing forward to the hearings, the Commission requests that participants requiring more than 25 minutes advise the Commission on or before **June 30, 2022**.

The Commission has made the following logistical arrangements to support parties' fulsome participation in the upcoming hearings:

Hotel Accommodations

The NPC will not be coordinating reservations or holding hotel accommodations for participants except for community representatives; each participant is responsible to secure its representatives' flights, accommodations, and meals. Given the limited hotel space in Cambridge Bay, Rankin Inlet, Pond Inlet and Iqaluit, the NPC encourages parties planning to attend the in-person hearings to secure their accommodations as soon as possible.
